## **Investigation of Runt Chicks**

Taken from the BVC Budgie News

Ever had one or two nests, have one or two chicks that just fail to thrive, yet the rest of the nest is fine? They have been coined runt chicks or woody chicks due to their spindly legs that have no muscle cover and thin brittle bones.

The BCV in its continuation to ensure animal welfare and assist breeders in obtaining best outcomes in their flocks asked me to investigate this. I was fortunate enough to go to aviaries throughout Victoria and investigate.

#### The Problem:

Breeders across various geographic locations are experiencing a Phenomenon where one or two chicks in a nest, known as "runt chicks" or "woody chicks," exhibit failure to thrive. These chicks have spindly legs with minimal muscle and thin brittle bones. Despite being in clean, well-ventilated environments, breeders report issues such as poor fertility, addled eggs, and early chick death. This problem affects breeders from champion to beginner levels. Is it a new contagious virus or a bacteria? Should I purchase from a breeder that has had this happen?

#### Symptoms of Runt Chicks:

- Smaller size compared to other chicks of similar age.
- At 10 days, leg rings fall off: even at 15-20 days, rings do not stay on due to spindly legs.
- Skinny malnourished appearance.
- Fragile bones with an inability to thrive.
- Often results in death while other chicks develop normally.

#### Initial Diagnostic Tests and Findings: Runt Chick Testing:

The initial step was to take samples for the common causes of sick birds: Multiple samples from a runt sample chick.

#### **Results:**

Sample from runt chick faeces- Culture growth at lab.

- Faecal culture NEGATIVE for Salmonella sp.
- Faecal culture NEGATIVE for Camylobacter sp.

- Faecal culture NEGATIVE for Yersinia sp.
- Normal intestinal flora was found from chick.

The runt chick was tested via-- PCR- Very sensitive test looking for DNA of viral and bacterial DNA- Feather: vent swab and a blood spot were analysed.

Chlamydia PCR: Not Detected.

Polyomavirus (French Moult) PCR: Not Detected.

As this wasn't much help, we then turned our attention to the parents.

#### Parent Bird Testing: Parents Results:

Sample from parents faeces- Culture grown at lab.

- Faecal culture NEGATIVE for Salmonella sp
- Faecal culture NEGATIVE for Camylobacter sp.
- Faecal culture NEGATIVE for Yersinia sp.
- Normal intestinal flora isolated.

Sample grown from Choana/mouth of parents:

1 Moderate growth of Raoultella ornithinolytica

\*\*\*\*\*As a side note we should look at the use of Doxycycline (Doxyvet) and Chlortetracycline (Triple C) as most breeders use this regularly and now it is ineffective on organisms it used to be effective on. However, they still have a role to play in chlamydia prevention / treatment.

Parents were also tested via—PCR test for DNA of viral and Bacterial DNA

Chlamydia PCR Not Detected

Polyomavirus (French Moult) PCR Not Detected

This was interesting but bacterial /viral cause was an unlikely cause given not all chicks were affected.

The next step was to humanely euthanase the runt chick and have it sent to an avian histopathologist to look at all internal organs for answers.

#### Histopathology of Runt Chick:

Results: (In layman's terms)

The lesions in the kidney indicated dehydration. The change in the adrenal glands was severe and consistent with adrenal insufficiency associated with stress. There was no microscopic evidence of Polyomavirus infection (French Moult) in the sections of liver, kidney or feathers. The changes in the liver showed that the chick was fighting general infection. There were no microscopic changes in liver to indicate any type of viral, bacterial or Chlamydial infection. There is dilation of mucous glands in the proximal oesophagus that may be a manifestation of early vitamin A deficiency. Sections of the intestine show large amounts of undigested plant material mixed with large numbers of mixed bacteria indicative of intestinal bacteria overgrowth. One unusual type of long gram-negative bacterium resembling a stack of coins. There is minimal inflammation of the intestine.

These results were fascinating... Most of the aviaries were supplementing with multiple products containing vitamin A.

All of this was presented to Dr Rob Marshall. Quite simply suggested the birds were not prepared well for the breeding process and needed almost ideal situations to have reproductive success. The parents had no reserves to buffer any adverse conditions. With unusual weather patterns becoming more common, birds have little ability to buffer extreme cold, heat and weather events causing reproductive breakdown unless prepared well. It would appear many birds without a strong prebreeding program are destined for failure. It was interesting to note that due to evolution the breeding desire in budgerigars is so strong that they will attempt to breed and raise young despite knowing they physically can't, they will still try. It is in my opinion this is where runt chicks come from.

DIAGNOSIS of the cause of THIS runt chick:

Poor pre-breeding management of parents... The chick had Vitamin A deficiency causing poor immunity and infection by a common bacteria that a strong bird would easily fight off. The remaining chicks survived but are pet shop quality birds probably with good genetics. The parents still feed the chicks but as they are depleted not with the required enthusiasm.

#### In Summary:

- The lack of systemic infection or a specific pathogen in all tested birds suggests that the problem is not due to an infectious disease spreading across nests.
- The combination of histopathological findings, such as vitamin A deficiency and intestinal bacterial overgrowth, points towards nutritional and environmental stress factors.
- The chronic stress observed in the adrenal glands and the dehydration seen in the kidneys of the runt chicks indicate poor parental vigour, leading to a failure to thrive in some offspring.

#### **Diagnosis:**

The primary cause of runt chicks appears to be inadequate pre-breeding management, resulting in poor parental health, enthusiasm and insufficient nutritional reserves. The combination of stress, poor nutrition and inadequate environmental conditions during the breeding process leads to these developmental issues in some chicks.

#### **Recommendations for Prevention and Management:**

#### 1 Breeding timing:

Avoid breeding during extreme weather conditions. Breeding should be confined to spring and autumn to minimise stress from heat and cold. Extreme temperatures cause parental exhaustion and stress, leading to poor parenting and increased susceptibility to infections.

#### 2 Mite Control:

Ensure nests and birds are free from mites, as infestation can reduce parents interest and vigour. Hens can't incubate well if preening for mites- both red mite and quill mites.

#### **3 Nutritional Management:**

• Focus on building reserves of critical vitamins (A, D3, E) during the nonbreeding season. A Robust pre-breeding program is essential for preparing parents for the stresses of raising young.

- B vitamins are also critical, being water soluble birds can excrete excess easily.
- Provide a balanced diet rich in essential nutrients- researching what amino acids, vitamins and minerals seed lack is a great starting point. I would encourage breeders to then look at their vitamin bottles after and ensure they contain them.
- Monitor seed quality and provide a variety of seeds. It is my opinion oil coated seeds with additives help the birds that selectively feed and may miss the nutritional benefits of the entire seed blend on offer.

#### 4 Supplementation:

Offer high quality, easily absorbable vitamins and minerals that match the needs of the birds at different stages of the breeding cycle.

Introduce new supplements and dietary changes gradually before the breeding season to ensure birds are accustomed to them.

By implementing these strategies, breeders can enhance the health and readiness of parent birds, thereby reducing the occurrence of runt chicks and ensuring more successful breeding outcomes.

Bird nutrition is key to this issue and perhaps a good future article.
